Intrusion of foreign economic domination, as well as military and political intervention, in states that have already achieved independence from colonial rule




Africa Architecture




Economy Trap with Foreign Trades

This brought the newly independent nation to the brink of collapse and a united Africa into jeopardy.




Ethiopia and Liberia
